
- Systematic assessment of communication skills

Integrate knowledge of patients' interests and motivations





Communication Strategy

Environment

Examples:

- Variation in caregiver approaches during activities
- Individually adjusted day-programmes, including frequent, short rests
- Use of a yes/no communication method
- Speak to the patient as if he/she understands • Ask questions and expect an answer providing the patient necessary time to answer • Place the patient in a position that encourage communication Set up patients' room, e.g. with • patients' private belongings • Use of humor and intonation Communication aids/assistive tech-nology for communication Further observations, tests and examinations
